CONNACHT TO HOST FÉILE PEILE NA NÓG 2019!

Connacht GAA will for the second time host Feile Peil na nÓg on the 28th, 29th and 30th of June 2019. Connacht GAA previously hosted Feile Peil na nOg in 2014 with 8 boys and 4 girls divisions and last year hosted the Hurling Féíle. This years version will be largest ever Féile held in the history of the tournament. There are 358 sides comprising of 23 divisions with an extra girls division added since the initial draw on April 4th at the Connacht GAA centre. There are 13 boys divisions with 10 girls divisions. In all but one division there are 16 teams. There will be 851 games played



commencing on 4.45pm on Friday evening until the last finals conclude at 4.30pm on Sunday evening in the Connacht GAA centre. Each county in Connacht will be hosting finals which will total 46 finals with the Connacht GAA centre hosting 18 finals.

The 2019 Connacht GAA Go Games Days in Croke Park took place on April 16th and 17th. In 2018 960 children across 48 teams participated from Connacht. This year 48 teams across hurling and football took part with over 1,000 kids attending, getting the opportunity to experience the field of dreams. The players involved got to play a number of games in Croke Park and get a tour of the Croke Park Museum. This initiative, which was spearheaded by former Connacht GAA Games Manager, John Tobin, first took place eleven years ago and has been an outstanding success.
